If you are selected to receive a Driver's Education Scholarship, you will be required to assist the Teen Motor Vehicle Safety (TMVS) Coalition in our efforts. By signing this form, you agree to assist the TMVS Coalition in the following ways:

Teen:

- Complete all driver's education class and road session requirements
- Support the TMVS Coalition by committing 4 volunteer hours within 4 months of completion of the driver's education course. Activities could include attending educational presentations in the community and assisting with registration and surveys, work with your school's seat belt campaign, etc.
- Complete an additional 300 word typed essay describing what you learned in driver's education class due 30 days after completing the course.

Parent/Legal Guardian:

- Support your teen driver and assist with completion requirements for the driver's education course,
- Attend an educational presentation to learn more about teen seat belt use and the Graduated Driver's License law within 4 months of your teens completion of the driver's education course,
- Bring at least one additional parent (neighbor, friend, colleague, etc.) to the educational presentation to help us reach and educate more parents about the issue at hand.

Driver's Education Scholarship 08-09

The Teen Motor Vehicle Safety (TMVS) Coalition of Larimer County announces the availability of 100 scholarships. Scholarship amounts are \$300 each (paid directly to the driver's education school), for teenagers (at least 14 ½ years old) to take a driver's education course. The scholarships are not intended to cover the entire cost of the course, but instead to supplement your contribution. The TMVS Coalition's goal is to increase awareness and compliance of the Graduated Driver's License (GDL) law and increase seat belt use among Larimer County teens to reduce motor vehicle crash fatalities.

In return for the scholarship, recipients and parents will be required to support the efforts of the TMVS Coalition including working with school-wide campaigns, educating the public, assisting with observational studies, etc. Please only submit an application if you and your parent(s)/legal guardian(s) are willing and able to participate. **NO** reimbursements for class payments are permitted through this grant.
